Andaman Islands. Twenty two members took part in this trip (6 had to cancel for some reasons) and participants thoroughly enjoyed the trip. Bhutan, located in the midst of Himalayas is a country with lots of natural beauty. It has a population of three quarter million and practice the religion of Buddhism. The impact of this peaceful religion can be felt in that people are so modest and peaceful – and hardly any fear of looting or violence. The country, as is to be expected, very hilly, but the beauty lies in its hills and valleys and lakes and rivers and greenery all around. Kolkata is a congested and a busy city but some of the relics and buildings left by the British Empire are the highlights of the city. The world famous Howrah Bridge and Queen Victoria museum were the highlight of our visit.



Andaman Islands are much in the limelight nowadays, and its beaches are considered the best in Asia. It also was used as a prison during the British Raj in India. Visit to the prison built by the British (or what is left of it) was emotional and eyes were wet seeing some of the things being done there. We visited one beach and that was wonderful.
